In compliance with a written request received January 10 19 85 , there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for H.B. 7 pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

HB 7 would remove the requirement of existing law that the copies of the Proceedings of the 1972 Constitutional Convention be sold at cost. Instead, the Legislative Council would have authority to set a sale price or otherwise decide how to dispose of remaining sets.

ASSUMPTIONS:

No dollar estimate is included because it is uncertain what price would be required to sell the remaining copies of the Proceedings of the 1972 Constitutional Convention. The goal of the Council is to liquidate the remaining 844 sets to avoid storage charges of \$55 a month and/or destruction of the books due to poor storage conditions in the Capitol basement. Under current law, the Proceedings are to be sold at cost, which has been determined to be \$350 a set. The only current costs may be attributable to depreciation as a consequence of deterioration which may be estimated at \$58,800 each year over the next 5 years.
