### FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request received <u>January 10</u> 19 <u>85</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>H.B. 17</u> pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Eliminate the requirement that notice be posted or otherwise communicated for the commission of the offense of criminal trespass to land; imposing absolute liability for certain criminal trespass to land; expanding the authority of wardens to enforce the criminal mischief, criminal trespass, and litter laws on private lands being used for recreational purposes.

# ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. We estimate the Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks was involved in 100 trespass cases per year over the past three years.
- 2. Each case requires approximately three days to respond, investigate, apprehend, and process through the courts.
- 3. We anticipate the new legislation will result in an increase of trespass cases by 32 times.
- 4. The number of cases will increase 5% per year.
- 5. The bill is passed and signed into law on April 1, 1985.

# LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

The anticipated increase in enforcement costs will continue into future years.

# TECHNICAL OR MECHANICAL DEFECTS OR CONFLICTS WITH EXISTING LEGISLATION:

The bill does not exclude persons involved in the conduct of official business. Costs to governmental agencies could increase if ownership must be determined through records prior to entering.

Some of the costs associated with enforcement may not relate to persons who purchase licenses. Other sources of revenue for this enforcement may be appropriate because of this.
