 6 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT MOVING CONTRACTOR
 7 RESIDENCY DETERMINATION RESPONSIBILITY FROM THE DEPARTMENT
 8 OF REVENUE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE; AMENDING SECTION
 9 18-1-106, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

12 Section 1. Section 18-1-106, MCA, is amended to read:

13 "18-1-106. Department of revenue commerce to determine
 14 residency of selected contractors -- applications for
 15 redetermination -- determination as prima facie evidence.

16 (1) The department of revenue commerce shall determine
 17 whether or not certain contractors, issued public
 18 contractor's licenses under the provisions of Title ~~15~~ 37,
 19 chapter ~~50~~ 71, are residents of the state of Montana within
 20 the meaning of 18-1-102 and 18-1-103. Any public agency
 21 charged by law with the responsibility for the execution of
 22 any contract subject to the provisions of 18-1-102 may
 23 request that a determination of resident/nonresident status
 24 be made by the department. All requests must specify the
 25 name and address of the licensed public contractor for whom

1 a determination of resident/nonresident status is required.

2 (2) If a determination is made that a licensed public
 3 contractor is not a resident but he thereafter qualifies as
 4 such, he may apply to the department of revenue commerce for
 5 a redetermination of his residency. If, upon
 6 redetermination, the licensed public contractor is found to
 7 qualify as a resident, he shall be furnished a letter by the
 8 department attesting to such status.

9 (3) The determination of the department of revenue
 10 commerce that a licensed public contractor is or is not a
 11 resident within the meaning of 18-1-102 and 18-1-103 is
 12 prima facie evidence of that fact."

13 NEW SECTION. Section 2. Effective date. This act is
 14 effective on passage and approval.
