In compliance with a written request received <u>January 10</u>, 19 <u>85</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>House Bill 70</u> pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 70 provides for a reduction in the crop share the State will receive from agricultural or grazing purposes when the lands are under sprinkler irrigation.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) Approximately 56,000 acres of trust land are sprinkler irrigated. Of this 56,000, 60% are alfalfa, 20% are barley and 20% are spring wheat.
- 2) Approximately 40,000 acres of sprinkler irrigated trust land are used for grazing.
- 3) One acre of sprinkler irrigated grazing will yield a carrying capacity of .80 animal unit months (AUM).

In compliance with a written request received <u>January 17</u>, 19 <u>85</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>H.B. 70/amended</u> pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 70, as amended, revises the rental requirements for state agricultural leases. The revision provides for a reduction of crop share for high production cost methods and authorizes alternative rental methods when in the best interest of the State.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

The legislation, in its present form, may effect the income generation from state lands under agricultural production. The legislation allows the department to lease agricultural lands on a basis that may increase revenue to the trust by allowing a flexible system to determine a fair rental rate. Lands that were incapable of agricultural production in the past due to the rental structure would become potential agricultural tract under this legislation.

While the legislation appears to increase income from state lands insufficient data exists to provide a specific revenue impact.
