 8 REQUESTING HIS ASSISTANCE AND MAY ACT AS IF HE WERE A PEACE
 9 OFFICER OF THAT ENTITY; AMENDING SECTION 44-11-101, MCA."

 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
 12 Section 1. Section 44-11-101, MCA, is amended to read:
 13 "44-11-101. Mutual assistance authorized -- powers and
 14 duties of assisting officers. A peace officer or any law
 15 enforcement entity of any county or municipality or a state
 16 government law enforcement entity may request the assistance
 17 of a peace officer from another law enforcement entity
 18 within the state of Montana. A peace officer, while in the
 19 jurisdiction of the requesting officer or entity and while
 20 on such request for assistance, has the same powers, duties,
 21 rights, privileges, and immunities as a peace officer of the
 22 requesting entity, is under the authority and supervision of
 23 the requesting officer or entity, and may act as though he
 24 were a duly appointed and qualified peace officer of the
 25 entity he is assisting."
