The option to reregister by mail need only be made available for vehicles registered at the close of the expiring registration period in the name of the applicant for reregistration.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act reassigning to the Division of Motor Vehicles implementation of the light vehicle reregistration by mail law.

ASSUMPTIONS:

The Department of Justice, Motor Vehicle Division, has been responsible for maintaining a mail registration systm for light vehicles. This bill merely corrects an erroneous reference to the Department of Revenue. It will have no effect on revenue. There will be no change in expenditures by either agency if this measure is approved.
