In compliance with a written request received January 11, 19 85, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for H.B. 138 pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 138 changes the inspection interval for low-pressure boilers from one year to two years.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

- There are approximately 1200 state-insured boilers that must be inspected annually under current law.
- Approximately 13% of all boilers are high-pressure boilers.
- Average number of boiler inspections per full-time inspector is 380-400. 3.
- There are approximately 300 boilers which must be checked to determine if they are state-insured. could add to the required number of inspections.

# FISCAL IMPACT ON STATE SPECIAL REVENUES:

This bill reduces the number of required boiler inspections. The current staff is not able to meet the current boiler inspection requirements. If this legislation is passed, the workload would be reduced so that current staff is adequate and there would be no fiscal impact.
