## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION

House Bill 158 changes the inspection interval for surface coal mines from three months to six months.

# ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. There are nine active surface coal mines to be inspected.
- 2. Present law mandates that each coal mine be inspected at least once a quarter or more often if necessary to ensure the safety of all mine employees.
- 3. There is presently one statutorily qualified inspector on staff, assigned exclusively to inspecting coal mines.
- 4. Average annual output per inspector is 38 inspections.
- 5. In addition to each quarterly inspection, a follow-up visit to each mine should be conducted each quarter and in response to complaints made.
