4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT RELIEVING THE COUNTY
5 TREASURER OF THE DUTY TO POST IN THREE PUBLIC PLACES THE
6 DELINQUENT LIST OF PERSONS AND PROPERTY OWING TAXES;
7 REQUIRING THE TREASURER TO POST ONLY THE NOTICE OF TAX SALE,
8 INCLUDING A STATEMENT THAT THE DELINQUENT LIST IS AVAILABLE
9 FOR INSPECTION IN THE TREASURER'S OFFICE; AMENDING SECTION
10 15-17-101, MCA."

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

13 Section 1. Section 15-17-101, MCA, is amended to read:
14 "15-17-101. Publication of notice of tax sales. (1) On
15 or before the last Monday of June of each year, the county
16 treasurer must publish in the manner and for the time
17 prescribed in this section a notice specifying:

18 (a) that at a given time and place (to be designated
19 in the notice), all property in the county upon which
20 delinquent taxes are a lien will be sold at public auction
21 unless prior to said time said delinquent taxes, together
22 with all interest, penalties, and costs due thereon, are
23 paid;

24 (b) a complete delinquent list of all persons and
25 property in the county now owing taxes, including all city

1 and town property as to which taxes or taxes and assessments
2 are delinquent, is on file in the office of the county
3 treasurer and is subject to public inspection and
4 examination.

5 (2) The publication must be made once a week for 3
6 successive weeks in such newspaper published in the county
7 as the board of county commissioners directs; if there is no
8 newspaper published in the county, then by posting a copy of
9 the ~~list~~ the notice in three public places.

10 (3) The publication must designate the time and place
11 of sale.

12 (4) The time of sale must not be less than 21 or more
13 than 28 days from the first publication, and the place must
14 be in front of the county treasurer's office."
