A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO INCREASE THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD OF LABOR APPEALS FROM THREE TO FIVE AND PROVIDE THAT ONE APPOINTEE REPRESENT EMPLOYEES AND ONE REPRESENT EMPLOYERS; AMENDING SECTION 2-15-1704, MCA."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
Section 1. Section 2-15-1704, MCA, is amended to read:
"2-15-1704. Board of labor appeals -- allocation -- composition -- function -- quasi-judicial. (1) There is a board of labor appeals.
(2) The board is allocated to the department for administrative purposes only as prescribed in 2-15-121.
(3) The board is composed of three five members of the public who are not employees of the state government, appointed by the governor as prescribed in 2-15-124. One appointee shall represent the interests of employees and one appointee shall represent the interests of employers.
(4) The board is designated as a quasi-judicial board for purposes of 2-15-124."

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:


House Bill 174 proposes to increase the Board of Labor Appeals from 3 members to 5 members.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1) The Board of Labor Appeals will continue to meet in Helena on an average of 2 days per month.
- 2) Each Board member will continue to work an average of 7 days per month.
- 3) Board members residing away from Helena will require 2 nights lodging, mileage and per diem each month.
- 4) The 2 new members would reside away from Helena as there are now 2 members on the Board from Helena.
