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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO ALLOW COLLECTION OF BOTH CIVIL AND CRIMINAL PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE MONTANA HAZARDOUS WASTE ACT OR OF A RULE, ORDER, OR PERMIT ISSUED PURSUANT TO IT; AMENDING SECTION 75-10-417, MCA."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 75-10-417, MCA, is amended to read:

"75-10-417. Civil penalties. (1) Any person who violates any provision of this part, a rule adopted under this part, an order of the department or the board, or a permit is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$10,000. Each day of violation constitutes a separate violation.

(2) The department may institute and maintain in the name of the state any enforcement proceedings under this section. Upon request of the department, the attorney general or the county attorney of the county of violation shall petition the district court to impose, assess, and recover the civil penalty. Any-civil-penalty-collected under-this-section-is-in-lieu-of-the-criminal-penalty provided-for-in-75-10-410.
