DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 291 is an act revising provisions concerning the Highway Patrolmen's retirement system; defining retirement benefits available upon death; defining the refund available upon resignation; increasing service retirement allowance; increasing the employer's and state's contribution to the retirement system; defining the eligibility requirements after July 1, 1985; and providing payment of a retirement allowance to certain Highway Patrolmen who have been discontinued from service after completing 5 years or more of service.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Assume that salaries will increase 2% in FY 1986 and FY 1987.
- Although 19-6-404 directs the employer's contribution to be paid from the general fund, it is assumed that the impact will be against the state special revenue fund since this has been and presumably will be the funding source from Patrol salaries.
- The number of Highway Patrol Officers and federal funding for the Patrol will remain constant. 3.

LONG-RANGE IMPACT:

The proposed legislation will permanently increase employer contributions by 2.01% of all future salaries. TECHNICAL NOTES:

- There is no coordination section with HB 292 which also increases employer contributions by 8.17%.
- Contributions from the employer are funded from the state special revenue fund not the general fund as stated in 19-6-404.
