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Introduced by Manager Contributions: An Act Providing a Minimum for the Monahe Patrolmen and their Beneficiaries; Providing Funding For the Monahe Minimum Monthly Benefit allowance through increased employee and employee contributions; amending sections 19-6-402 and plant 10

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Minimum monthly benefit factors allowance. (1) Subject to the limitations contained in subsection (2), the following retired highway patrolmen and their beneficiaries are eligible to receive a monthly benefit allowance of not less than 2% multiplied by the patrolman's creditable years of service multiplied by the current base salary received by a probationary highway patrolman:

- (a) a retired patrolman who is 55 years of age or older, or his beneficiary, who is receiving a service retirement allowance;
- (b) a retired patrolman, or his beneficiary, who is receiving a disability retirement allowance; and
 - (c) a beneficiary receiving a survivorship allowance.

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(2) (a) The maximum monthly benefit allowance paid under subsection (1) may not exceed 60% of the current base salary of a probationary highway patrolman.

(b) The annual increase in a monthly benefit allowance under subsection (1) may not exceed 5% of the current monthly benefit allowance paid to a retired highway patrolman or his beneficiary.

In compliance with a written request received January 23,	1985, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal
Note for House Bill 292 pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4,	Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA).
Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is avail	able from the Office of Budget and Program
Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.	

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 292 is an act providing a minimum monthly benefit allowance for certain Highway Patrolmen and their beneficiaries, providing funding for the minimum benefit allowance through increased employees and employer contributions.

ASSUMPTION:

- 1. Assume that salaries will increase 2% in FY 1986 and FY 1987.
- 2. Although 19-6-404 directs the employer's contribution to be paid from the general fund, it is assumed that the impact will be against the state special revenue fund since this has been and presumably will be the funding source for Patrol salaries.
- 3. The number of Highway Patrol Officers and federal funding for the Patrol will remain constant.

LONG-RANGE IMPACT:

This legislation will permanently increase the employer contributions for the Highway Patrol Retirement System by 8.17% of all future salaries.

TECHNICAL NOTE:

This legislation does not include a coordination section with HB 291 which also increases employer contributions by 2.01%.
