10 (4) The election administrator in each county shall 11 prepare suitable nonpartisan ballots or place the names of 12 candidates on the regular general election ballot in the same manner as other nonpartisan candidates for the election 13 of supervisors, which ballots shall be delivered to the 14 15 election judges in those precincts which contain registered 16 electors prior to each general election and each primary 17 election in which more than four candidates are nominated. The election judges and other election officials in such 18 19 precincts shall submit such ballots to qualified electors, conduct the election, and tabulate the results of such 20 election in the manner provided in Title 13." 21
