This part does not apply to 15 employment of: 16 (1) registered professional engineers, surveyors, real 17 estate appraisers, or registered architects; (2) physicians, dentists, or other medical, dental, or 18 19 health-care providers; and (3) expert witnesses hired for use in litigation, 20 hearings officers hired in rulemaking and contested case 21 22 proceedings under the Montana Administrative Procedure Act, or attorneys as specified by executive order of the 23 24 governor; or (4) consulting actuaries to the public retirement 25

2 Section 2. Section 19-3-305, MCA, is amended to read: "19-3-305, Employment of actuary biennial 3 ---investigation and valuation. (1) The board shall retain, on 4 5 a full-time basis, a competent actuary who is a member of 6 the American academy of actuaries and who is familiar with public systems of pensions. The actuary shall be the 7 technical advisor of the board on matters regarding the 8 operation of the system. Biennially he shall make an 9 actuarial investigation into the suitability of the 10 11 actuarial tables used by the system and an actuarial 12 valuation of the assets and liabilities of the retirement system. From time to time, he shall also determine the rate 13 of interest being earned on the retirement fund. He shall 14 15 report his findings to the board.

(2) The board may retain an actuary in a manner it 16 considers to be in the best interests of the state and may 17 18 contract for a period not to exceed 10 years. Payment and 19 performance obligations for those bienniums following the biennium in which a contract is made are subject to the 20 21 availability and appropriation of funds therefor." 22 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Extension of authority, Any existing authority of the public employees' retirement board 23 to make rules on the subject of the provisions of this act 24
