14 Section 1. Short title. [This act] may be cited as the 15 "Missing Children Act of 1985".

16 Section 2. Definitions. As used in [this act], the 17 following definitions apply:

- (1) "Missing child" means any person who has been reported as missing to a law enforcement authority and:
 - (a) who is under 18 years of age;
- 21 (b) whose temporary or permanent residence is in 22 Montana or is believed to be in Montana; and
- 23 (c) whose location has not been determined.
- 24 (2) "Missing child report" is a report prepared on a 25 form designed by the department of justice for use by

Section 3. Missing children information program.

22 Section 4. Reports to missing children information 23 program. (1) All state, county, and municipal law 24 enforcement authorities shall submit to the missing children

25 information program provided for in [section 3] any missing



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child report and other information required by 44-2-401.

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- (2) Any parent, quardian, or legal custodian may submit a missing child report to the missing children information program on any child whose whereabouts are unknown, regardless of the circumstances, subsequent to making a report to the appropriate law enforcement authority within the county in which the child became missing.
- (3) The parent, quardian, or legal custodian responsible for notifying the missing children information program or a law enforcement authority of a missing child shall immediately notify the authority and the program of any child whose location has been determined.
- Section 5. Duties of law enforcement authority. Whenever a parent, guardian, or legal custodian of a child files a report with a law enforcement authority that the child is missing, the law enforcement authority shall:
- 17 (1) immediately inform all on-duty law enforcement officers of the existence of the missing child report; 18
 - (2) communicate the report to all other law enforcement authorities having jurisdiction in the county; and
- 22 (3) immediately enter the missing child report into 23 the national crime information center computer system.
- 24 Section 6. List of missing Montana school children.
- 25 (1) The superintendent of public instruction shall assist

- the missing children information program provided for in 1 [section 3] in identifying and locating missing children who are enrolled in Montana public school districts in kindergarten through grade 12 by:
 - (a) collecting each month a list of missing Montana school children as provided by the missing children information program provided for in [section 3];
- · (b) distributing the list of missing school children 8 on a monthly basis, unless the list has no change from the 9 previous month's information, to all school districts 10 11 admitting children to kindergarten through grade 12;
- (c) designing the list to include pertinent available 12 information for identification of the missing school child, 13 including if possible a recent photograph of the child; and 14
 - (d) notifying the appropriate law enforcement agency and the missing children information program as soon as any additional information is obtained or contact is made with respect to a missing school child.
 - (2) Each school district in Montana shall:
- (a) distribute to each school building within the 20 district the list of missing school children provided for in 21 subsection (1); and 22
- (b) notify the appropriate law enforcement agency at 23 the earliest known contact with any child whose name appears 25 on the list of missing school children.

Section 7. Notice to parents of children absent from school. The trustees of any elementary or high school district shall establish a system for contacting before noon of a school day any parent, guardian, or legal custodian whose child is absent from school but who has not reported the child as absent for the school day to determine whether the parent, guardian, or legal custodian is aware of the child's absence from school.

FISCAL NOTE

In compliance with a written request received January 24, 19 85, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for House Bill 358 pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 358 creates a missing children information program within the Department of Justice; requiring law enforcement authorities to submit reports on missing children to the program; to require the Superintendent of Public Instruction to distribute each month a list of missing school-age children to the schools; and to require schools to contact any parent whose child is absent without parental verification of the absence.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- It is assumed that the Department of Justice, Identification Bureau, Missing Unidentified Persons Unit, will 1. be responsible for the collection and preparation of the monthly missing school children circulars which will be printed and distributed by the Office of Public Instruction.
- There will be five missing children per year who are missing for more than thirty days; thus requiring a 2. Missing child Circular to be distributed to the schools.
- 3. It will be necessary for the Identification Bureau to prepare an information brochure to be distributed to all law enforcement agencies and schools informing them of the program and its procedures.
- 4. The additional workload and other costs associated with the program that are not mentioned in the fiscal impact will be absorbed by the Department of Justice.

The Department of Justice has requested funds through the budget modification process to support the 1.0 FTE who functions as the missing persons specialist, (44-2-401 & 44-2-401, MCA). Expenditure items such as rent, travel, telephone, and equipment have not been included in this fiscal note since the individual handling this program would assume any duties resulting from the proposed legislation. The costs here are only those which would be incurred by the Department of Justice in addition to current operations.
