Certification of building code inspectors. 11 (1) For purposes of this section, "building code inspector" 12 means a person employed or contracted by the department or a 13 building department of a municipality or county to examine 14 plans and specifications or inspect buildings, construction, 15 or equipment to ascertain compliance with applicable state, 16 municipal, or county building, plumbing, electrical, or 17 mechanical codes. 18

19 (2) The department and each municipality and county 20 shall require certification by the department, under rules 21 adopted by it, as proof of qualification to be a building 22 code inspector. In adopting such rules, the department may 23 incorporate standards adopted by the international 24 conference of building officials with such modifications as 25 the department considers appropriate. A building code

 1, 1985, must be certified upon hiré or within 1 year of
