INTRODUCED BY Ling Junch HAR 12 Realing By REQUEST OF THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE Harris 2 3 4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ALLOWING AN 5 OUT-OF-STATE PERSON WHO OPERATES A VEHICLE CARRYING PERSONS 6 SOLELY ENGAGED IN TOURIST-TYPE ACTIVITIES TO OBTAIN A 7 FUEL USER'S COURTESY VEHICLE PERMIT; AMENDING 8 SPECIAL SECTION 15-70-302, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE 9 DATE." 10

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 12 Section 1. Section 15-70-302, MCA, is amended to read: 13 "15-70-302. Special fuel dealer's licenses and special 14 fuel user's permits required -- exceptions. (1) It shall be 15 unlawful for any person to act as a special fuel dealer in 16 this state unless such person is the holder of an uncanceled 17 fuel dealer's license issued to him by the department. 18

(2) Every special fuel user shall obtain annually from 19 the department, prior to the use of such special fuel for 20 the propulsion of a motor vehicle or vehicles in this state, 21 a special fuel user's permit and shall at all times display 22 the original or a reproduced copy of the permit in each such 23 vehicle or vehicles operated by him upon the highways as 24 herein defined which shall be exhibited for inspection on 25



request of any checking station officer, Montana highway 1 2 patrol officer, authorized employee of the department, or 3 any other law enforcement officer. The special fuel user 4 shall be responsible for reproducing clear and legible copies of the permit. 5

6 (3) A special fuel user's permit is not required of any person whose sole use of special fuel is for the 7 propulsion of a privately operated passenger automobile 8 provided the person purchases special fuel, tax paid, from a q licensed special fuel dealer in this state. For purposes of 10 11 this exemption, a privately operated passenger vehicle does not include a motor vehicle used for the transportation of 12 13 persons for hire or for compensation or designed, used, or maintained primarily for transportation of property. 14

15 (4) Any out-of-state user who has no bulk storage 16 facility in this state and purchases special fuel, tax paid, from a licensed fuel dealer and operates a special fuel 17 18 vehicle solely to carry persons engaged in tourist-type activities or for recreation or for religious, charitable, 19 20 educational, or other eleemosynary purposes shall secure a 21 special fuel user's courtesy vehicle permit. The permit 22 shall not be transferable and shall be valid for 90 days. 23 Permits will be issued at no cost to the user by the 24 department, the department of highways scale house 25 personnel, and gross vehicle weight patrol crews. department <u>of highways</u> may require the user who has fuel
 capacity in excess of 30 gallons to file a report and pay
 the tax on fuel used in Montana on which the tax has not
 been paid."

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. Extension of authority. Any 6 existing authority of the department of revenue to make 7 rules on the subject of the provisions of this act is 8 extended to the provisions of this act, and under such 9 authority the department of revenue shall define and delimit 10 the terms used in this act.

11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3. Effective date. This act is 12 effective on passage and approval.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 452 allows an out-of-state person who operates a vehicle carrying persons solely engaged in tourist-type activities to obtain a special fuel user's courtesy vehicle permit.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Approximately 3,000 charter buses travel in Montana each year.

2. 1,200 to 1,700 purchase temporary fuel permits.
