12	Section 1. Section 44-10-103, MCA, is amended to read:
13	"44-10-103. Establishment of academy. There is hereby
14	established a Montana law enforcement academy to be located

16	unit-shall-be-selected-in-themannerhereinafterprovided

18	Section 2. Section 44-10-202, MCA, is amended to read:

(4) determine the curriculum and methods of training
for the officers attending the academy;
(5) select and hire such staff as it deems necessary
to implement this chapter;
(6) establish rules for the conduct of the officers at
the academy;
(7) award appropriate certificates to the officers who
successfully complete their training, which certificates
shall be signed by the president of the-selecteduniversity
unit western Montana college;
(8) provide for the keeping of permanent records of
enrollment, attendance, and graduation and such other
records as the department may deem necessary;
(9) make a yearly report in writing of the activities
of the academy. Copies of this report shall be sent to the

governor, attorney general, and secretary of state.

(10) do all other things necessary and desirable for

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- the establishment and operation of the academy not 1 inconsistent with this chapter or the constitution and 3 statutes of the state of Montana; 4
- (11) accept and expend grants from federal, state, 5 county, and city governments or private persons, 6 associations, or corporations."
- 7 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Appropriation. appropriated from the general fund for the biennium ending June 30, 1986, to the department of justice the sum of \$1,000,000 to be used for the purpose of establishing facilities suitable for the Montana law enforcement academy.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 508 is an act transferring the Montana Law Enforcement Academy and its ancillary services from their present location to a site at or near the Western Montana College Campus in Dillon.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The primary fiscal impact of House Bill 508 is the one-time costs for construction, renovation, land purchase and moving. Therefore, it is assumed that the annual operational costs of the current site versus the Dillon site versus a new building in Bozeman, are relatively comparable and are not a factor in this fiscal note.
- 2. The costs projected here are based on the Academy's needs as outlined in the Attorney General's proposal for a new Academy facility in Bozeman.
- 3. It is assumed that the option to buy the temporary facilities in Bozeman would be exercised on July 1, 1986. And, the buildings would continue to be utilized, but would not produce revenue to offset the purchase cost.
- 4. The Western Montana College will contract with the Montana Law Enforcement Academy to provide some services for the academy students. Included would be dorm space, food service, and P.E. Complex facilities. The contract would allow Western Montana College to cover its cost of operations. Therefore, it can be expected that the revenues would equal the expenses incurred.
