Upon the filing of the 2 3 affidavit, the justice shall have an additional 30 days to decide the matter which has been submitted. No cause, 4 5 motion, or other proceeding may remain undecided for more than 120 days after submission for decision without the approval of a majority of the other members of the supreme 7 court for good cause shown in an affidavit requesting additional time. If a justice of the supreme court violates 10 the provisions of this section, any party to a matter 11 pending in violation of this section or, by a majority vote, 12 the other members of the supreme court may refer the matter 13 to the judicial standards commission. If the court, acting upon the recommendation of the commission, determines the 14 15 justice is not in compliance with this section, it shall 16 order that the state auditor not issue a warrant for payment 17 of services for 1 month, which pay is forfeited by the 18 justice.
