8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9 Section 1. Section 2-15-1010, MCA, is amended to read:

10 "2-15-1010. Teachers' retirement board -- terms --
 11 allocation. (1) There is a teachers' retirement board.

12 (2) The board consists of ~~six~~ seven members appointed
 13 by the governor, as follows:

14 (a) the superintendent of public instruction;

15 (b) ~~two~~ three persons appointed from the teaching
 16 profession who are members of the retirement system;

17 (c) two persons appointed as ~~representatives-of-the~~
 18 public members at large;

19 (d) one member who shall be a retired teacher who was
 20 a member of the retirement system at the time of retirement.

21 (3) Each appointed member of the board shall serve a
 22 term of 4 years. Each appointed member shall take and
 23 subscribe to the oath prescribed by section 3 of Article III
 24 of the constitution of the state. The oath shall be filed
 25 in the office of the secretary of state.

1 (4) The board is allocated to the department for
 2 administrative purposes only as prescribed in 2-15-121.
 3 However, the board may hire its own personnel, and
 4 2-15-121(2)(d) does not apply."

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 539 would add an additional member to the Teachers' Retirement Board.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. New member would live within a 200 mile radius of Helena.
2. Member would attend 5 meetings each year and arrive the day before the meeting.
3. New member would be eligible for \$50.00 per day per diem and in-state mileage, meals and lodging allowance.
