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 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT RELATING TO CERTIFICATION OF TEACHERS IN THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS OF MONTANA AND TO TEACHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS AND PROGRAMS; CREATING A BOARD OF TEACHING AND A TEACHER ETHICS PANEL; RAISING TEACHER CERTIFICATION FEES; AMENDING SECTIONS 20-1-101, 20-2-121, 20-4-102 THROUGH 20-4-104, AND 20-4-106 THROUGH 20-4-111, MCA."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE StATE OF MONTANA:
NEW SECTION. Section 1 . Board of teaching. (1) There is a board of teaching.
(2) The board consists of 15 members appointed by the governor. The membership of the board includes:
(a) four elementary classroom teachers;
(b) four secondary classroom teachers, one of whom may be a postsecondary vocational-technical teacher;
(c) one faculty member from an accredited institution of higher education;
(d) one school district administrator;
(e) one member from a school district board of trustees;
(f) one member from the board of public education;
(g) the commissioner of higher education or his designee as an ex officio member;
(h) the superintendent of public instruction or his designee as an ex officio member; and
(i) one member from the general public.
(3) The board is allocated to the board of public education for administrative purposes only as prescribed in 2-15-121. However, the board may hire its own personnel and the provisions of 2-15-121(2)(d) do not apply.
(4) All board members are voting members of the board.
(5) (a) The term of office of an appointed member is 3 years. Before the expiration of the term of a member, the governor shall appoint a successor to assume the duties on the next following July 1 . A member is eligible for reappointment, but only for one additional term. In case of a vacancy for any cause, the governor shall make an appointment to become immediately effective for the unexpired term. If a member's employment status changes from the status that qualified him for appointment on the board, the member's position becomes vacant at that time.
(b) An appointed member of the board may be removed from the board by the governor for cause, after a hearing.
(c) Original appointments must be made for staggered terms of 1,2 , and 3 years as determined by the governor.
(6) The governor shall appoint the members of the

board listed in subsections (i)(a) through (l)(d) from nominees submitted by statewide organizations of professional educators. Each organization that submits a nominee shall certify that the nominee is qualified for the board position for which he is nominated.
(7) Each member of the board, except those members listed in subsections (l)(e) through (i)(i), must:
(a) have been actively engaged in teaching or providing related educational, administrative, or supervisory service in a public school or an accredited institution of higher education with an approved teacher education program for at least 5 years, including 3 years in Montana, immediately preceding nomination and appointment; and
(b) be a Montana resident.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Officers -- quorum -expenses. (1) The board of teaching shall select a chairman and a vice-chairman from among its appointed menoers.
(2) A quorum for meeting is not less than nine board members.
(3) Board members are entitled to travel expenses incurred for each day of attendance at board meetings or in the performance of any duty or service as a board member in accordance with 2-18-501 through 2-18-503.

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Meetings of the bourd.
(1) The board of teaching shall meet quarterly and at such other times as may be required for the priper conduct of the business of the board at the call of the chairman.
(2) The principal office of the board must be in Heiena, Montana, but the board may act and exercise ail of its powers at any other location.

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Adoption of rules -- seal -record of proceedings. 11) The board of teaching may adopt rules for the conduct of board business.
(2) The bcard shall use an official seal to authenticate its official acts.
(3) The board shall keep a record of its proceedings. Section 5. Section 20-1-101, MCA, is amended to read:

Such policies shall provide for:

The superintendent of public instruction shall not issue a teacher or specialist certificate to any person who does not satisfy the qualifications or other requirements of this title and of the board of pubtic education teaching policies for teacher or specialist certification."

Section 9. Section 20-4-104, MCA, is amended to read:
"20-4-104. Qualifications. (1) Any person may be certified as a teacher when he satisfies the following qualifications:

Section 10. Section 20-4-106, MCA, is amended to read:
"20-4-106. Classifications of teacher and specialist certificates. (1) The superintendent of public instruction shall issue teacher certificates and the board of pubtie eductition teaching shall adopt teacher certification policies on the basis of the following classifications of teacher certificates:
(a) The class 1 professional certificate may be issued
to an otherwise qualified applicant who has completed a an approved teacher education program which includes a bachelor's degree and a minimum of 1 year of study beyond such degree in a unit of the Montana university system or an equivalent institution. The professional certificate may be endorsed for elementary instruction, secondary instruction, or both, and for specified subject fields on the basis of the applicant's academic and professional training and according to the board of pubtie-education teaching policy for teacher certification endorsement.
(b) The class 2 standard certificate may be issued to an otherwise qualified applicant who has completed a-4-year an approved teacher education program and who has been awarded a bachelor's degree by a unit of the Montana university system or an equivalent institution. The standard certificate may be endorsed for elementary instruction, secondary instruction, or both, and for specified subject fields on the basis of the applicant's acadenic and professional training and according to the board of pubtie education teaching policy for teacher certification endorsement.
(c) The class 3 administrative and supervisory certificate may be issued to an otherwise qualified applicant who is eligible for a teacher certificate endorsed For teaching in the school or schools in which he would be
an administrator or he would supervise. The applicant also shall possess the training and experience required by the policies of the board of pubite-edueation teaching for an endorsement as superintendent, principal, or supervisor.
(d) The class 4 vocational, recreational, or adult education certificate may be issued to an otherwise qualified applicant who has the qualifications of training and experience required--by--the--Bnited--States--offiee--of edueation--or--the-quatifications required by the special needs of the several vocational, recreational, or adult education fields and who can qualify under the policy of the board of pubłic-education teaching for the issuance of this classification of teacher certification.
(e) The class 5 provisional certificate may be issued to an otherwise qualified applicant who can provide satisfactory evidence of his intent to qualify in the future for a class 1 or a class 2 certificate and who has completed a 4-year college program or its equivalent and holds a bachelor's degree from a unit of the Montana university system or its equivalent. The provisional certificate may be endorsed for elementary instruction, secondary instruction, or both, and for special subject fields on the basis of the applicant's academic and professional training and according to the board of pubzie-edreation teaching policy for teacher or specialist certification endorsement.

(1) The board of pabtie-edueation teaching shall have the power and authority to suspend or revoke the teacher or specialist certificate of any person for any of the following reasons:
(a) making any statement of material fact in the application for a certificate which the applicant knows to be false;
(b) any reason that would have required or authorized the denial of the teacher or specialist certificate to such person if it had been known at the time such certificate was issued;
(c) incompetency;
(d) gross neglect of duty;
(e) conviction in this state or any other state or country of a criminal offense involving moral turpitude;
(f) substantial and material nonperformance of the employment contract between the teacher or specialist and the trustees of a district without good cause or the written consent of the trustees; or
(g) denial, revocation, suspension, or surrender of a teacher or specialist certificate in another state for any
reason constituting grounds for such action in this state.
(2) The board of teaching shall initiate proceedings under this section if, and only if, a request for the suspension or revocation of the teacher or specialist certificate of any person is made to it by:
(a) the trustees of a district as to a teacher or specialist employed by that district within the 12 months immediately preceding receipt of the request by the board of pubtie-caucation teaching; or
(b) the superintendent of public instruction as to a teacher or specialist not employed by any district within the 12 months immediately preceding receipt of the request by the board; or
(c) the teacher ethics panel provided for in Isection 17].
(3) The board of teaching shall give a 30 -day written notification to any person when the board intends to consider the suspension or revocation of his certificate. The board shall conduct an investigation of the reasons for the suspension or revocation charge and then, if the investigation warrants further action, conduct a hearing in the manner provided by board policies. At the hearing the board shall afford the person an opportunity to defend himself and his qualifications against the charge.
(4) After a full investigation and proper hearing, the
board of teaching may suspend or revoke the person's teacher or specialist certificate, except that in the case of a first violation under subsection (l)(f) above, the maximum penalty shall not be more than a 2-year suspension of the person's certificate.
(5) Whenever the superintendent of public instruction denies the issuance or the renewal of a teacher or specialist certificate to a person, he may appeal the denial to the board of pubtie-edueation teaching. The appeal shall be heard in the same manner provided for in this section for suspension or revocation and in accordance with the policies of the board. The decision of the board shall be final."

Section 15. Section 20-4-111, MCA, is amended to read:
"20-4-111. Emergency authorization of employment. (1) Any district may request from the superintendent of public instruction an emergency authorization of employment for a person who is not the holder of a valid teacher or specialist certificate as an instructor of pupils when such district cannot secure the services of a person holding a valid certificate. The person shall have previously held a valid teacher or specialist certificate or shall meet the standards of preparation prescribed by the policies of the board of pubite--edacation teaching for and during such emergency. Such emergency authorization of employment shall indicate:
(a) the district to which such authorization is issued;
(b) the person whom the district is authorized to employ;
(c) the endorsement for elementary or secondary instruction and the specific subject fields for which authorization to employ such person is given; and
(d) the school fiscal year for which such emergency authorization of employment is given.
(2) Emergency authorization of employment of a person shall be valid for the school fiscal year identified on such authorization and may be renewed in accordance with the board of pubife-education teaching policies. A fee of-sz not to exceed $\$ 10$ and, if no teacher or specialist certificate or emergency authorization of employment has ever been issued for such person, a filing fee of $\$ \mathcal{\$} \$ 5$ shall be paid for the issuance of an emergency authorization of employment. The--superintendent-of-pubtie-instruction-shatu deposit-the-fees-with-the-state-treasurer-to-the--eredit-of the--generat The fees must be paid to the board of teaching account in the state special revenue fund.
(3) Emergency authorization of employment of a person may be revoked for good cause in accordance with the provisions of 20-4-110."

NEW SECTION. Section 16. Standards for approval ofteacher education programs. (1) After considering recommendations of the board of public education, the board of regents, and the superintendent of public instruction, the board of teaching shall adopt rules establishing standards for approval of teacher education programs.
(2) Whenever any teacher education program is denied approval status or has such status withdrawn, the denial or withdrawal of status must be treated as a contested case. All appeals and hearings must be held in accordance with the appropriate provisions of the Montana Administrative Procedure Act.
NEW SECTION. Section 17. Teacher ethics panel. (1) There is a teacher ethics panel to receive complaints and make recommendations to the board of teaching regarding ethical conduct of teachers.
(2) The panel consists of five teachers, two of whom must be tenure elementary teachers and two of whom must be tenure secondary teachers. Each panel member must hold a valid Montana teaching certificate.
(3) The panel members are appointed by a majority vote of the board of teaching from nominations submitted by statewide professional organizations of teachers.
(4) Panel members shall serve a single term of 3 to 5 years pursuant to board rules. Initial terms must be staggered.
(5) The teacher ethics panel shall:
(a) receive complaints regarding the ethical conduct of teachers from any member of the teaching profession or other citizen;
(b) if a complaint appears to have a reasonable basis, hold a factfinding hearing to review the evidence and afford the teacher named in the complaint an opportunity to refute the complaint; and
(c) if the panel determines that the facts support a probable showing of one of the reasons for suspension or revocation of a teacher's certificate provided in 20-4-110, recommend that the board of teaching initiate proceedings under 20-4-110.

NEW SECTION. Section 18. Protection of prior rights. The transfer of duties, functions, and powers to the board of teaching does not affect any action, suit, proceeding, or prosecution involving or with respect to such duties, functions, and powers commenced prior to and pending at the time of the transfer, except that the board of teaching is substituted for the superintendent of public instruction or the board of public education in such action, suit, proceeding, or prosecution.

NEW SECTION. Section 19. Codification instruction. Sections 2 through 4 and 16 and 17 are intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 20.

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In compliance with a written request received February $18, \quad 19 \quad 85$, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for H.B. 556 pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA) Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 556 is an act to create a Board of Teaching and a Teacher Ethics Panel to prescribe and adopt policies for teacher certification and to receive complaints and make recommendations regarding ethical conduct of teachers.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1) The Board of Teaching will not administer the teacher certification process.
2) The Board of Teaching will meet a minimum of 4 times each year.
3) Each Beard of Teaching member will attend a minimum of 4 meetings each year, travel 220 miles round trip for each meeting, be reimbursed 1.5 days meals for each meeting, and will require lodging a minimum of one night per meeting.
4) The Board of Teaching will hire an executive secretary and a secretary for an annual cost of $\$ 27,600$ and $\$ 14,400$ respectively.
5) Office space, substantial printing costs, and other operational expenses will be necessary.
6) A total of 3,170 teacher certification renewals are issued annually, 1 , 400 initial certificates are issued annually, and 1,480 class 5 certificates are issued annually.
7) Maximum fees allowed in the bill will be charged.
8) A total of 548 school districts with 3 class 7 substitute teachers each will need initial certification under provisions of the bill.

1) The current fee structure for certification of teachers brings in $\$ 64,540$ annually which would be $\$ 8,418$ under the required expenditures for the proposed law. The fees collected under present structure go to the general fund.
2) Assuming that maximum fees are charged for teacher certification under the proposed law, $\$ 317,200$ annually would be collected to the Board of Teaching State Special Revenue fund to pay incurred expenditures of $\$ 72,958$ per year. Fees could be set at lower levels to keep revenues similar to expenditures.
