A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO FREEZE THE SALARIES

5 OF CERTAIN ELECTED EXECUTIVE BRANCH, JUDICIAL BRANCH, AND

LEGISLATIVE BRANCH OFFICIALS OF THE STATE FOR 2 YEARS AT

JULY 1, 1984, LEVELS; AMENDING SECTIONS 5-2-301 AND 5-2-302,

MCA: AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

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WHEREAS, the Legislature wishes to aid in balancing the state government's budget; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature wishes to and of right should
take the lead in balancing the state government's budget;
and

WHEREAS, the departments and other agencies of the state cannot be expected to operate without increased appropriations if elected officials receive salary increases; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature is committed to avoiding any general tax increases that would further erode the buying power of the people and their standard of living.

THEREFORE, the Legislature of the State of Montana declares that it declines to raise the salaries of the elected officials listed in section 2-16-405, MCA, thereby freezing those salaries during the fiscal biennium beginning

July 1, 1985, at the July 1, 1984, levels, and the Legislature further declares that, by this act, it freezes the salaries of its members for the same biennium.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 5-2-301, MCA, is amended to read: 7 "5-2-301. Compensation and expenses for members while 8 in session. (1) Legislators are entitled to a salary 9 commensurate to that of the daily rate of a grade 8, step 2, classified state employee for those days during which the 10 legislature is in session, except that for the fiscal 11 12 biennium beginning July 1, 1985, the salary must remain at the July 1, 1984, level. The president of the senate and the 13 14 speaker of the house shall receive an additional \$5 a day in 15 salary for those days during which the legislature is in session. 16

- (2) Legislators are entitled to \$45 a day, 7 days a week, during a legislative session, as reimbursement for expenses incurred in attending a session. Expense payments shall stop when the legislature recesses for more than 3 days and shall resume when the legislature reconvenes.
- 22 (3) Legislators are entitled to a mileage allowance as 23 provided in 2-18-503 for each mile of travel:
- 24 (a) to the place of the holding of the session and to
 25 return to their place of residence at the conclusion of the

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- 2 (b) for one additional round trip to their place of 3 residence during each session.
 - (4) In addition to the mileage allowance provided for in subsection (3), legislators are entitled to two additional round trips to their place of residence during each regular session upon submittal of an appropriate claim for such mileage reimbursement to the office of legislative council.
- 10 (5) Legislators are not entitled to any additional
 11 mileage allowance under subsection (3)(a) or (3)(b) for a
 12 special session if it is convened within 7 days of a regular
 13 session."
 - Section 2. Section 5-2-302, MCA, is amended to read:
 "5-2-302. Compensation and expenses when legislature
 not in session. When the legislature is not in session,
 members of the legislative council, legislative
 subcommittees, and select and interim committees, while
 engaged in authorized committee business, are entitled to:
 - a mileage allowance as provided in 2-18-503;
 - (2) expenses as provided in 2-18-501 and 2-18-502; and
 - (3) a salary equal to one full day's pay at the rate of a classified state employee, described in 5-2-301 for each 24-hour period of time (from midnight to midnight), or portion thereof, spent away from home on authorized

committee business, except that for the fiscal biennium
beginning July 1, 1985, the salary must remain at the July
1, 1984, level. However, if time spent for business other
than authorized committee business results in lengthening a
legislator's stay away from home into an additional 24-hour
period, he may not be compensated for the additional day."

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. This act is
effective July 1, 1985.
