

HOUSE BILL NO. 581 INTRODUCED BY Maller Ellips 1 2 3 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE 4 DEPARTMENT OF FISH, WILDLIFE, AND PARKS TO ISSUE AVICULTURAL 5 THE TAKING OF MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS FOR 6 PERMITS FOR 7 PROPAGATION PURPOSES; AMENDING SECTION 87-4-902, MCA." 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 9 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Taking migratory game birds 10 for propagation -- avicultural permit. (1) The department 11 may issue avicultural permits for taking, capturing, and 12 possessing migratory game birds, as defined in 87-2-101(7), 13 for the purpose of propagation. Before issuing an 14 avicultural permit, the department must determine that the 15 applicant has been issued the appropriate federal permit or 16 that the applicant will receive the appropriate federal 17 permit subject to concurrence by the department. 18 (2) An avicultural permit issued under this section 19 must specify: 20 (a) the species of migratory game birds allowed to be 21 22 taken under the permit; (b) whether eggs or hatched birds, or both, may be 23 24 taken; (c) the number of eggs or hatched birds, or both, that 25



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(d) areas in which collection may be made;

(e) means by which collection may be made;

4 (f) the time period for which the permit is valid; and
5 (g) any other conditions imposed by the department
6 under rules adopted pursuant to subsection (5).

(3) Hatched migratory game birds or their eggs taken 7 8 under an avicultural permit issued in accordance with this 9 section remain the property of the state and may be disposed 10 of only with the permission of the department. Progeny of 11 hatched migratory game birds taken under permit as provided 12 in this section become the private property of the holder of the permit who propagates such migratory game birds, and the 13 14 owner may sell or transfer such birds as private property, 15 subject to any applicable state or federal law or 16 regulation.

17 (4) An applicant for a migratory game bird avicultural
18 permit who is denied a permit by the department may seek a
19 remedy under the contested case hearing provisions of Title
20 2, chapter 4.

In compliance with a written request received <u>February 1</u>, <u>19</u><u>85</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>H.B. 581</u> pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Authorize the Department of Fish, Wildlife, and Parks to issue avicultural permits for the taking of migratory game birds for propagation purposes.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The greatest demand for permits will involve swans and cranes.
- 2. We estimate 30 requests each for the swans and the cranes and 30 requests for all other birds each year.
- 3. Each permit request will require one day in-office follow-up and one day of field investigation.
- 4. Investigations of bird populations will be required to determine the impact of removal. This will involve initial investigations of swan and crane populations, and then annual follow-up studies.
- 5. The birds anticipated to be in greatest demand are found in remote and restrictive habitat. This will make investigations more time consuming.
- 6. The legislation provides for no permit fee.

7. No permits would be issued the first year because of the need for population studies.

5 A statement of intent is necessary for this bill 6 because section 1 grants rulemaking authority to the department of fish, wildlife, and parks. It is the intent of 7 the legislature that the department adopt rules providing 8 for coordination with federal agencies in the issuance of 9 avicultural permits and enforcement of conditions and 10 restrictions imposed by the federal migratory game bird 11 12 regulations.


