DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

"An Act to Authorize the Confiscation and Disposal of Contraband Possessed by Residents of Correctional Institutions; Providing an Immediate Effective Date."

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Any cash in excess of the amount allowed by department policy would be deposited into the Inmate Welfare Fund.
2. This fund is not state money and therefore not in the State Treasury.



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5 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE  
6 CONFISCATION AND DISPOSAL OF CONTRABAND POSSESSED BY INMATES  
7 OR RESIDENTS OF ADULT OR YOUTH CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS;  
8 PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA;

11 Section 1. Disposition of contraband. (1) Cash  
12 possessed in excess of the amount allowed by the policy of a  
13 AN ADULT OR YOUTH correctional institution or obtained in  
14 violation of such a policy may be confiscated and deposited  
15 in an inmate OR RESIDENT welfare fund to be used for the  
16 intended purpose of that fund.

17 (2) The department of institutions shall adopt  
18 policies for the disposition of other contraband confiscated  
19 from inmates OR RESIDENTS in ADULT OR YOUTH correctional  
20 institutions. Receipts from the sale of contraband must be  
21 deposited in an inmate OR RESIDENT welfare fund to be used  
22 for the intended purpose of that fund.

23 Section 2. Codification instruction. Section 1 is  
24 intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 53, and  
25 the provisions of Title 53 apply to section 1.

1 Section 3. Effective date. This act is effective on  
2 passage and approval.
