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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Disposition of contraband. (1) Cash possessed in excess of the amount allowed by the policy of a correctional institution or obtained in violation of such a policy may be confiscated and deposited in an inmate welfare fund to be used for the intended purpose of that fund.

(2) The department of institutions shall adopt policies for the disposition of other contraband confiscated from inmates in correctional institutions. Receipts from the sale of contraband must be deposited in an inmate welfare fund to be used for the intended purpose of that fund.

Section 2. Codification instruction. Section 1 is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 53, and the provisions of Title 53 apply to section 1.
