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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE TRANSFER OR EXCHANGE OF CONVICTED OFFENDERS UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF TREATY AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Exchange of offenders under treaty. If a treaty in effect between the United States and a foreign country provides for the transfer, by exchange or otherwise, of convicted offenders to the country of which they are citizens or nationals, the governor may, on behalf of the state and subject to the terms of the treaty, authorize the director of the department of institutions to consent to the transfer or exchange of offenders in Montana institutions and take any other action necessary to initiate the participation of this state in the treaty.

20 Section 2. Extension of authority. Any existing
21 authority of the department of institutions to make rules on
22 the subject of the provisions of this act is extended to the
23 provisions of this act.

Section 3. Codification instruction. Section 1 is
 intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 53, and



the provisions of Title 53 apply to section 1.

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

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 Section 1. Exchange of offenders under treaty.
