5 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE
 6 TRANSFER OR EXCHANGE OF CONVICTED OFFENDERS UNDER THE
 7 PROVISIONS OF TREATY AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 Section 1. Exchange of offenders under treaty. If a
 11 treaty in effect between the United States and a foreign
 12 country provides for the transfer, by exchange or otherwise,
 13 of convicted offenders to the country of which they are
 14 citizens or nationals, the governor may, on behalf of the
 15 state and subject to the terms of the treaty, authorize the
 16 director of the department of institutions to consent to the
 17 transfer or exchange of offenders in Montana institutions
 18 and take any other action necessary to initiate the
 19 participation of this state in the treaty.

20 Section 2. Extension of authority. Any existing
 21 authority of the department of institutions to make rules on
 22 the subject of the provisions of this act is extended to the
 23 provisions of this act.

24 Section 3. Codification instruction. Section 1 is
 25 intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 53, and

1 the provisions of Title 53 apply to section 1.

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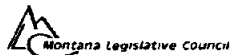
