A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM GENERAL FUND BUDGET SCHEDULES FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS AND
HIGH SCHOOLS: AMENDING SECTIONS 20-9-316 THROUGH 20-9-319, MCA; AND PROUIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."
be it enacted by the legislature of the state of montana:
Section 1. Section 20-9-316, MCA, is amended to read:
"20-9-316. Elementary school maximum budget schedule for $\ddagger 983-84$ 1985-86. (1) For each elementary school having an ANB of nine or fewer pupils, the maximum shall be $\$ \pm 8,6 z 7$ $\$ 19,649$ if said school is approved as an isolated school.
(2) For schools with an ANB of 10 pupils but less than 18 pupils, the maximum shall be $\$ \pm 8,6 z 7$ \$19,649 plus $\$ 770 \div 50$ $\$ 821.20$ per pupil on the basis of the average number belonging over nine.
(3) For schools with an ANB of at least 14 pupils but less than 18 pupils that qualify for instructional aide funding under 20-9-322, the maximum shall be $\$ 30-53 z$ \$32, 207 plus $\$ 778.5 \theta \$ 821.20$ per pupil on the basis of the average number belonging over 14.
(4) For schools with an ANB of 18 pupils and employing
one teacher, the maximum shall be $\$ 25-634 \$ 27,040$ plus $\$ 778.5 \theta \$ 821.20$ per pupil on the basis of the average number belonging over 18, not to exceed an ANB of 25 .
(5) For schools with an ANB of 18 pupils and employing two Eull-time teachers, the maximum shall be $\$ 4 \theta ; 926$ \$43,172 plus $\$ 487=5 \theta$ \$514.30 per pupil on the basis of the average number belonging over 18, not to exceed an ANB of 50 .
(6) For schools having an ANB in excess of 40 , the maximum on the basis of the total pupils (ANB) in the district for elementary pupils will be as follows:
(a) For a school having an ANB of more than 40 and employing a minimum of three teachers, the maximum of $\$ \pm ; 809$ $\$ 1.908$ shall be decreased at the rate of $\$ 7.76$ \$1.85 Eor each additional pupil until the total number (ANB) shall have reached a total of 100 pupils.
(b) For a school having an ANB of more than 100 pupils, the maximum of $\$ \pm 7703 \$ 1,797$ shall be decreased at the rate of $\$ t=6 \pm \$ 1.69$ for each additional pupil until the ANB shall have reached 300 pupils.
(c) For a school having an ANB of more than 300 pupils, the maximum shall not exceed $\$ 7 \boldsymbol{t} 38 \mathrm{z}$ \$1,458 for each pupil.
(7) The maximum per pupil for all pupils (ANB) and tor all elementary schools shall be computed on the basis of the amount allowed herein on account of the last eligible pupil

(ANB). All elementary schools operated within the incorporated limits of a city or town shall be treated as one school for the purpose of this schedule."

Section 2. Section 20-9-317, MCA, is amended to read:
"20-9-317. High school maximum budget schedule for 1983-84 1985-86. (1) For each high school having an ANB of 24 or fewer pupils, the maximum shall be $\$ \pm \theta 6 ; \pm 55$ \$111,986.
(2) For a secondary school having an ANB of more than 24 pupils, the maximum $\$ 4 ; 4 z\}$ \$4,666 shall be decreased at the rate of $\$ 24= \pm z \$ 25.45$ for each additional pupil until the ANB shall have reached a total of 40 such pupils.
(3) For a school having an ANB of more than 40 pupils, the maximum of $\$ 4 ; 037 \$ 4,259$ shall be decreased at the rate of $\$ 24= \pm z \$ 25.45$ for each additional pupil until the ANB shall have reached 100 pupils.

(8) The maximum per pupil for all pupils (ANB) and for all high schools shall be computed on the basis of the amount allowed herein on account of the last eligible pupil (ANB). All high schools and junior high schools which have been approved and accredited as junior high schools, operated within the incorporated limits of a city or town, shall be treated as one school for the purpose of this schedule."

Section 3. Section 20-9-318, MCA, is amended to read:
"20-9-318. Elementary school maximum budget schedule for $\ddagger 984-85 \quad \underline{1986-87}$ and succeeding years. For $1984-85$ 1986-87 and succeeding school years, the elementary school maximum budget schedule is as follows:
(1) For each elementary school having an ang of nine or fewer pupils, the maximum shall be $\$ \neq 7 \pm 86 \underline{\$ 20,242}$ if said school is approved as an isolated school.
(2) For schools with an ANB of 10 pupils but less than 18 pupils, the maximum shall be $\$ \neq 97 \pm 86 \$ 20,242$ plus $\$ 8 \theta \pm \% 8 \theta$ $\$ 846$ per pupil on the basis of the average number belonging over nine.
(3) For schools with an ANB of at least it pupils but

(5) For schools with an ANB of 18 pupils and employing two full-time teachers, the maximum shall be $\$ 47,454 \$ 44,474$ plus $\$ 5 \theta z-7 \theta$ \$ 529.80 per pupil on the basis of the average number belonging over 18 , not to exceed an ANB of 50 .
(6) For schools having an ANB in excess of 40 , the maximum on the basis of the total pupils (ANB) in the district for elementary pupils will be as follows:
(a) For a school having an ANB of more than 40 and employing a minimum of three teachers, the maximum of $\$ \$ 7863$ $\$ 1.965$ shall be decreased at the rate of $\$ 178 \pm \$ 1 . \underline{91}$ for each additional pupil until the total number (ANB) shall have reached a total of 100 pupils.

Section 4. Section 20-9-319, MCA, is amended to read:
"20-9-319. High school maximum budget schedule for ¥984-85 1986-87 and succeeding years. For $\pm 984-85$ 1986-87 and succeeding school years, the high school maximum budget schedule is as follows:
(1) For each high school having an ANB of 24 or fewer pupils, the maximum shall be $\$ \pm \theta 9,34 \theta$ \$115,329.
(2) For a secondary school having an ANB of more than 24 pupils, the maximum $\$ 4,556$ \$4,805 shall be decreased at the rate of $\$ 24.85 \$ 26.21$ for each additional pupil until the ANB shall have reached a total of 40 such pupils.
(3) For a school having an ANB of more than 40 pupils, the maximum of $\$ 4, \$ 58 \$ 4,386$ shall be decreased at the rate of $\$ 24.85$ \$26.21 Eor each additional pupil until the ANB shall have reached 100 pupils.
(4) For a school having an ANB of more than 100 pupils, a maximum of $\$ 27667 \$ 2,813$ shall be decreased at the
rate of $\$ 4-76 \$ 4.38$ for each additional pupil until the ANB shall have reached 200 pupils.
(5) For a school having an ANB of more than 200 pupils, the maximum of $\$ z-Z 5 z \$ 2,375$ shall be decreased by $\$ z-z B$ \$2.41 for each additional pupil until the ANB shall have reached 300 pupils.
(6) For a school having an ANB of more than 300 pupils, the maximum of $\$ 2 \boldsymbol{T} \boldsymbol{\theta z \xi} \$ 2,134$ shall be decreased at the rate of $4 Z 44$ cents until the ANB shall have reached 600 pupils.
(7) For a school having an ANB over 600 pupils, the maximum shall not exceed $\$ \pm 7897$ \$2,001 per pupil.
(8) The maximum per pupil for all pupils (ANB) and for all high schools shall be computed on the basis of the amount allowed herein on account of the last eligible pupil (ANB). All high schools and junior high schools which have been approved and accredited as junior high schools, operated within the incorporated limits of a city or town, shall be treated as one schcol for the purpose of this schedule."
NEW SECTION. Section 5. Effective date. This act is effective July $1,1985$.
