HOUSE BILL NO. 593 1 INTRODUCED BY Menaban 2 BY REQUEST OF THE BOARD OF MORTICIANS 3 4 5 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO REQUIRE PROMPT 6 REFRIGERATION OR EMBALMING OF HUMAN REMAINS AND TO REQUIRE 7 ORDERLY CREMATION OF HUMAN REMAINS." 8 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 10 Section 1. Purpose. The legislature finds that certain 11 practices in storing human remains and in performing 12 cremations violate common notions of decency and generally held expectations. In enacting [sections 1 through 4], the 13 14 legislature is reaffirming that certain practices, which 15 have never been acceptable, violate principles of human 16 dignity. 17 Section 2. Prompt refrigeration or embalming of human

17 section 2. Frompt ferrigeration of embalaning of human 18 remains. Any person authorized to dispose of human remains 19 must refrigerate or embalm the body within 24 hours. Upon 20 written authorization of the proper state or local 21 authority, the provisions of this section may be waived for 22 a specified period of time.

23 Section 3. Provision of embalming services without
24 charge. If a person authorized to dispose of human remains
25 does not have refrigeration units, embalming services must

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1 be provided without charge.

2 Section 4. Orderly cremation of human remains. (1) A 3 person authorized to dispose of human remains may not 4 cremate or cause to be cremated more than one body at a time 5 unless written permission has been received from the person 6 or persons having the authority to order cremation.

7 (2) The board may adopt rules specifying the identity 8 of persons having authority to order cremation and 9 specifying the circumstances under which and the form in 10 which written authority must be given to order cremation of 11 more than one body at a time.

Section 5. Codification instruction. This act is
intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 37,
chapter 19, and the provisions of Title 37, chapter 19,
apply to this act.
