8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

9 Section 1. Section 61-12-703, MCA, is amended to read:

10 "61-12-703. Disposition of traffic fines collected
11 from juveniles. All fines collected by the district courts
12 from persons under 18 years of age as the result of traffic
13 summonses for unlawful operation of motor vehicles issued by
14 peace officers of cities or counties or by highway
15 patrolmen, together with the percentage of the fines
16 otherwise deductible by law, shall be retained by the county
17 treasurer of the county in which the offense occurred and at
18 the end of each month distributed as follows:

19 (1) Fines collected as the result of summonses issued
20 by city peace officers shall be distributed to the city in
21 which the peace officer is employed and credited to the city
22 general fund.

23 (2) Fines collected as the result of summonses issued
24 by county peace officers shall be retained by the county
25 treasurer and credited to the county road-fund sheriff.

1 (3) Fines collected as the result of summonses issued
2 by state highway patrolmen shall be paid to the state
3 treasurer, who shall credit them to the general fund of the
4 state.

5 (4) That portion of the fines deductible by law shall
6 be paid to the state treasurer, who shall credit the money
7 to the appropriate accounts in the state special revenue
8 fund."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 61-12-703, MCA, is amended to read:

"61-12-703. Disposition of traffic fines collected from juveniles. All fines collected by the district courts from persons under 18 years of age as the result of traffic summonses for unlawful operation of motor vehicles issued by peace officers of cities or counties or by highway patrolmen, together with the percentage of the fines otherwise deductible by law, shall be retained by the county treasurer of the county in which the offense occurred and at the end of each month distributed as follows:

(1) Fines collected as the result of summonses issued by city peace officers shall be distributed to the city in which the peace officer is employed and credited to the city general fund.

(2) Fines collected as the result of summonses issued by county peace officers shall be retained by the county treasurer and credited to the county road-fund sheriff

GENERAL FUND.

(3) Fines collected as the result of summonses issued by state highway patrolmen shall be paid to the state treasurer, who shall credit them to the general fund of the state.

(4) That portion of the fines deductible by law shall be paid to the state treasurer, who shall credit the money to the appropriate accounts in the state special revenue fund."
