### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 692 establishes a class of trapping license for youths and places a minimum age restriction on other trapping licenses.

### ASSUMPTIONS:

- It is assumed most youth trappers trap under a landowner trappers license or trap with a parent.
- It is assumed that about two trappers per county would take advantage of this license at \$3 each.
- It is also assumed that currently there are approximately 30 youths buying the \$20 trapping license. 3.
- It is assumed that the number of nonresident trapper's licenses sold would not be affected by the proposed law.
- It is assumed that the effective date is July 1, 1985. 5.
