"90-4-202. Allocation formula. (1) The department of social and rehabilitation services may use not more than 5% of the total weatherization funds for administration of the weatherization program.

- (2) Each of the governor's-substate-planning-districts human resource development councils shall receive that fraction of the remaining money as the number of eligible households in the district bears to the total number of eligible households in the state.
- (3) The department of social and rehabilitation services may transfer weatherization money governoris---substate---planning--districts human resource development councils if it finds that the money is not being expended in accordance with the terms of the agreements executed to carry out the provisions and purposes of this section and federal laws and regulations.
- (4) Each of the governor+s-substate-planning-districts human resource development councils shall submit plans and

proposed agreements to the units of local government in the district for review and comment before the agreements are approved by the department of social and rehabilitation services."

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Extension of authority. Any existing authority of the department of social and rehabilitation services to make rules on the subject of the provisions of this act is extended to the provisions of this act.
