BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 9 Section 1. Children's trust fund account. There is a 10 children's trust fund account in the state special revenue 11 fund in the state treasury. The money in the account is 12 allocated to the children's trust fund board for funding 13 services and activities under and payment of administrative 14 costs of the child abuse and juvenile delinquency prevention 15 program provided for in [section 3]. At least 50% of the 16 money deposited in the account each year must remain in the 17 fund and may not be allocated until the fund reaches 18 \$1,000,000. At that time all money generated by or deposited 19 the account each year may be allocated, but the 20 in 21 \$1,000,000 must remain in the fund.

22 Section 2. Children's trust fund board. (1) There is a 23 children's trust fund board attached to the department of 24 social and rehabilitation services for administrative 25 purposes only as provided in 2-15-121. The board has seven



members, two chosen by the president of the senate, two 1 chosen by the speaker of the house of representatives, two 2 chosen by the governor, and one chosen by the director of 3 the department of social and rehabilitation services. The 4 members chosen by the president of the senate and the 5 speaker of the house may not be legislators. The persons 6 The 7 chosen must be interested in child development. legislators' appointees serve 2-year terms, the governor's 8 appointees serve 3-year terms, and the department appointee 9 10 serves a 1-year term. A member may be removed only for good cause relating to the functions of the office. Any vacancy 11 must be filled for the unexpired term only and in the same 12 manner as the original appointment. 13

14 (2) The board must elect a chairman, hire a secretary,
15 and meet as often as necessary at the call of the chairman,
16 but not less than twice a year.

(3) Unless he is a full-time salaried officer or 17 employee of this state or of a political subdivision of this 18 state, each member is entitled to be paid \$50 for each day 19 in which he is actually and necessarily engaged in the 20 performance of board duties, and he is also entitled to be 21 reimbursed for travel expenses, as provided for in 2-18-501 22 through 2-18-503, incurred while in the performance of board 23 duties. Members who are full-time salaried officers or 24 employees of this state or of a political subdivision of 25

(4) A majority of the membership constitutes a guorum 5 to do business. A favorable vote of at least a majority of 6 7 all members of a board is required to adopt any resolution. motion, or other decision, unless otherwise provided by law. 8 Section 3. Child abuse and juvenile delinguency 9 prevention program. (1) The children's trust fund board 10 shall use the money in the children's trust fund account 11 established by [section 1] to fund services and activities 12 13 operated by nonprofit community-based educational and 14 service organizations attempting to prevent child abuse and 15 juvenile delinguency.

Monetary gifts, 8 contributions, and grants must, upon receipt, be paid into 9 the children's trust fund account established by {section 10 1}.

Section 5. Program costs. The costs incurred by the children's trust fund board in administering the child abuse and juvenile delinquency prevention program must be paid for with money from the children's trust fund account established by [section 1].

In compliance with a written request received <u>February 25</u>, 19<u>85</u>, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>House Bill 733 as amended</u> pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA) Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 733 establishes and funds a child abuse and juvenile delinquency prevention program, providing for a Children's Trust Fund Board and granting the Board rule making authority. ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Department of Health will issue 17,000 certified copies per year, producing \$51,000/yr. in revenue.
- 2. The \$3.00 charge is in addition to the current \$5.00 charge currently collected under MCA 5-15-111.
- 3. No estimate available on Clerk and Recorder collection of 3 additional dollars per copy.
- 4. 50% of the funds collected, less administrative costs, must not be spent but remain in the account.
- 5. Seven board members would receive \$50/day plus travel and per diem.
- 6. There would be at least three (3) meetings a year.
- 7. Contributions would be minimal.
- 8. Clerical would be contracted out instead of having a full time person.
- 9. Social and Rehabilitation Services will administer the program.
