DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

H.B. 749 delegates responsibility to Department of Highways to maintain all paved constructed secondary roads in the state.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Maintenance of secondary roads means maintenance of the paved constructed secondary system or 2,367.6 miles presently maintained by counties.
- 2. Cost per mile for the next 5 years would be \$4,400 per mile (1985 base cost). Cost per mile of \$4,400 is considered necessary for the next 5 years to bring the roads up to standard.
- 3. Department of Highways would require 180 additional F.T.E.'s. Counties would require less F.T.E.'s.

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LOCAL IMPACT:

HB 749 would reduce county secondary road maintenance. The counties cost of secondary road maintenance is unknown. The Department of Highways would require 180 additional F.T.E.'s. Counties would require less F.T.E.'s.

LONG RANGE IMPACT:

Beyond FY 87, it is estimated that 20 miles of new paved highway will be completed each year. Using the 1985 base cost of \$4,400 per mile to maintain, an additional expenditure of \$88,000 plus inflation would be incurred by the Department of Highways each fiscal year.
