DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

House Bill 821 makes alcoholism treatment and psychiatric services a mandatory service to be covered under the Montana Medicaid Program.

ASSUMPTIONS:

 Inpatient Treatment: Inpatient Admissions - 4557 (20% increase over 1984) Inpatient Program - 25 days

2. <u>Outpatient Treatment</u>: Outpatient Admissions - 5857 (20% increase over 1984) Treatment Periods - 6 months Treatment Per Month - 3 Cost of Program - \$180/day Medicaid Utilization - 15%

Cost of Program - \$40/treatment Medicaid Utilization - 15%

3. Assumed 20% increase over 1984 admissions no increase in '86, '87.

- 4. Assumed & FTE increase for program administration.
- 5. Assumed 4% cost increase '86, '87.

6. Assume all treatment will be performed in licensed hospital, skilled or intermediate care facility.
