Section 1. Statewide raffles by certain organizations authorized. (1) The conducting of statewide raffles by nonprofit service, civic, fraternal, religious, and charitable organizations and participating in the raffles is lawful, and the raffles are exempt from the provisions of part 2 of this chapter. They are also exempt from the provisions of this part, except that 23-5-402(1)(b) and (2)(b), 23-5-416, and 23-5-423 apply.

- (2) Each raffle must be licensed by the secretary of state upon payment of a license fee in an amount commensurate with the cost of processing and issuing the license.
- (3) A person who knowingly violates this section or a provision of this part applying to statewide raffles commits a criminal offense and may be fined not to exceed \$1,000, imprisoned in the county jail not to exceed 3 months, or both.

Section 2. Codification instruction. Section 1 is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 23, chapter 5, part 4, but the only provisions of part 4 that apply to section 1 are 23-5-402(1)(b) and (2)(b), 23-5-416, and 23-5-423.
