Section 1. Section 13-12-205, MCA, is amended to read:

13-12-205. Arrangement of names -- rotation on ballot. (1) The candidates' names shall be arranged alphabetically on the ballot according to surnames under the title of the respective offices.
(2) (a) $\ddagger f$ Except as provided in subsection (3), if two or more individuals are candidates for nomination or election to the same office, the election administrator shall divide the ballot forms into sets equal in number to the greatest number of candidates for any office. The candidates for nomination to an office by each political party shall be considered separately in determining the number of sets necessary for a primary election.
