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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT CHANGING THE SCHOOL ELECTION DAY TO THE FIRST TUESDAY AFTER THE FIRST MONDAY IN JUNE; REQUIRING SCHOOL TRUSTEES TO HOLD AN ELECTION ON INCREASING THEIR BUDGET AUTHORITY AND LIMITING SUCH ELECTIONS TO ONE EACH YEAR; AND AMENDING SECTIONS 13-1-104, 20-3-304, 20-9-111, 20-9-353, 20-20-105, AND 20-20-201. MCA."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: Section 1. Section 13-1-104, MCA, is amended to read: "13-1-104. Times for holding general elections. (1) A general election shall be held throughout the state in every even-numbered year on the first Tuesday after the first Monday of November to vote on ballot issues required by Article III, section 6, or Article XIV, section 8, of the Montana constitution to be submitted by the legislature to the electors at a general election, unless an earlier date is provided in a law authorizing a special election on an initiative or referendum pursuant to Article III, section 6. and to elect federal officers, state or multicounty district officers, members of the legislature, judges of the district court, and county officers when the terms of such offices

will expire before the next scheduled election for the offices or when one of the offices must be filled for an unexpired term as provided by law. 3

- 4 (2) A general election shall be held throughout the state in every odd-numbered year on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November to elect municipal officers, 6 officers of political subdivisions wholly within one county 7 and not required to hold annual elections, and any other officers specified by law for election in odd-numbered years 9 when the term for the offices will expire before the next 10 3.1 scheduled election for the offices or when one of the offices must be filled for an unexpired term as provided by 12 1.3 law.
- (3) The general election for any political subdivision 14 required to hold elections annually shall be held on school 15 election day, the first Tuesday of--April after the first 16 Monday in June of each year, and is subject to the election 17 procedures provided for in 13-1-401." 18
- Section 2. Section 20-3-304, MCA, is amended to read: 19 "20-3-304. Annual election. In each district an 20 election of trustees shall be conducted annually on the 21 22 regular school election day, the first Tuesday of-April after the first Monday in June. Election of trustees shall 23 comply with the election provisions of Title 13 and this 24 title." 25

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Section 3. Section 20-9-111, MCA, is amended to read:

"20-9-111. Initial budget items for completion —
estimated budgeting authority. (1) During the month of March
May, the county superintendent shall complete the portions
of the budget form providing information about the last
completed school year and, separate from the budget form,
estimate the maximum amount to be available for the general
fund budget in the ensuing year without an additional levy.

By April June 10, the county superintendent shall send to
each district two copies of the budget form, the general
fund estimate, and any other information or data as may be
required by the superintendent of public instruction or that
the county superintendent may deem necessary.

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Section 4. Section 20-9-353, MCA, is amended to read:

"20-9-353. Additional <u>budget authority and levy</u> for
general fund -- election for authorization to impose. (1)

The trustees of any district may propose to adopt a general fund budget in excess of the general fund budget amount for such district as established by the schedules in 20-9-316

(2) Upon receipt of the budget forms, the district

shall complete those portions of them which require

information about the then-current school year."

(a) building, altering, repairing, or enlarging any schoolhouse of the district;

through 20-9-321 for any of the following purposes:

- 3 (c) acquisition of land for the district;

- (2) When the trustees of any district determine that an additional amount--of--financing budget authority is required for the general fund budget that is in excess of 9 the statutory schedule amount or the district's current budget authority, the trustees shall submit the proposition 10 11 of an additional levy budget authority to raise such excess amount of--general--fund--financing to the electors who are 12 13 qualified under 20-20-301 to vote upon such proposition except that no election shall be required to permit the 14 15 school trustees to use federal funds received under Title I 16 of Public Law 81-874 to increase the school district's general fund budget as established in 20-9-316 through 17 20-9-321 by the amount of these funds. Such special election 18 shall be called and conducted in the manner prescribed by this title for school elections. The ballot for such 20 21 election shall state the amount of money-to-be-raised-by 22 additional property---taxation budget authority, 23 approximate number of mills required to raise such money in 24 excess of other sources of revenue, and the purpose for which such-money the budget authority will be expended used,

 - (b) Whenever the purpose of the additional budget authority is to build, repair, alter, or enlarge a schoolhouse or to furnish additional school facilities or to acquire land, authorization for additional budget authority is effective for only 1 school fiscal year.
 - t37(4) If the election on any additional tevy budget authority for the general fund is approved by a majority vote of those electors voting at such election, the proposition shall carry and the trustees may use any portion or all of the authorized amount in adopting the preliminary general fund budget. The trustees shall certify the additional levy amount authorized by such a-special election on the budget form that is submitted to the county superintendent, and the county commissioners shall levy such number of mills on the taxable value of all taxable property within the district, as prescribed in 20-9-141, as are required to raise the amount of such additional levy.
 - (4)(5) Authorization Except as provided in subsection (3), authorization to levy an additional tax under the provisions of this section shall be effective for only 1 school fiscal year and shall be authorized by a-special an election conducted before-August-1-of on the regular school

- 8 school elections may be conducted at such times as
- 9 determined by the trustees."
- 10 Section 6. Section 20-20-201, MCA, is amended to read:
- 11 "20-20-201. Calling of school election. (1) At least
- 12 40 days before any school election, the trustees of any
- 13 district shall call such school election by resolution,
- 14 stating the date and purpose of such election, and shall
- 15 conduct it in accordance with the procedures required by
- 16 law, when:
- 17 (a) an election must be held on the regular school
- 18 election day;
- 19 (b) in their discretion, the trustees order an
- 20 election for a purpose authorized by law;
