MCA: AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE." 10 11 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: Section 1. Section 7-32-303, MCA, is amended to read: 13 "7-32-303. Peace officer employment, education, and 14 15 certification standards. (1) For purposes of this section. 16 unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, "peace officer" means a deputy sheriff, undersheriff, police 17 18 officer, highway patrolman, fish and game warden, campus 19 security officer, or airport police officer. 20 (2) No sheriff of a county, mayor of a city, board,

21 commission, or other person authorized by law to appoint 22 peace officers in this state shall appoint any person as a 23 peace officer who does not meet the following qualifications 24 plus any additional qualifying standards for employment 25 promulgated by the board of crime control:

(a) be a citizen of the United States;

(b) be at least 18 years of age;

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3 (c) be fingerprinted and a search made of the local,
4 state, and national fingerprint files to disclose any
5 criminal record;

6 (d) not have been convicted of a crime for which he
7 could have been imprisoned in a federal or state
8 penitentiary;

9 (e) be of good moral character, as determined by a10 thorough background investigation;

(f) be a high school graduate or have passed the general education development test and have been issued an equivalency certificate by the superintendent of public instruction or by an appropriate issuing agency of another state or of the federal government;

16 (g) be examined by a licensed physician, who is not 17 the applicant's personal physician, appointed by the 18 employing authority to determine if the applicant is free 19 from any mental or physical condition that might adversely 20 affect performance by the applicant of the duties of a peace 21 officer;

(h) successfully complete an oral examination
conducted by the appointing authority or its designated
representative to demonstrate the possession of
communication skills, temperament, motivation, and other

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characteristics necessary to the accomplishment of the
 duties and functions of a peace officer; and

3 (i) possess or be eligible for a valid Montana
4 driver's license.

5 (3) At the time of appointment a peace officer must 6 take a formal oath of office.

7 (4) Within 10 days of the appointment, termination,
8 resignation, or death of any peace officer, written notice
9 thereof must be given to the board of crime control by the
10 employing authority.

(5) (a) Except as provided in subsections (b) and (c) 11 of this subsection, it is the duty of an appointing 12 authority to cause each peace officer appointed under its 13 authority to attend and successfully complete, within 1 year 14 of the initial appointment, an appropriate peace officer 15 basic course certified by the board of crime control. Any 16 peace officer appointed after September 30, 1983, who fails 17 18 to meet the minimum requirements as set forth in subsection (2) or who fails to complete the basic cou se as required by 19 this subsection forfeits the position, aut orily, and arrest 20 powers accorded a peace officer in this state. 21

(b) A peace officer who has been issued a basic
 certificate by the board of crime control <u>OR-HAS-COMPbETED-f</u>
 <u>BASIC-PEACE-OFFICER_S-COURSE-IN-ANOTHER-STATE</u> and whose last
 date of employment as a peace officer was <u>36-MONTHS-OR</u> less

1	than-36-months THAN 36 MONTHS prior to the date of his
2	present appointment as a peace officer is not required to
3	fulfill the basic educational requirements of subsection
4	(5)(a). <u>If-such-peace-officer's-last-date-of-employment-as-a</u>
5	peaceofficerwas-36-or-more BUT-bESS-THAN-60 months-prior
6	to-the-date-of-his-present-employment-as-a-peace-officer;-he
7	may-satisfy-his-basic-educational-requirements-as-setforth
8	insubsection(5)(c) IF SUCH PEACE OFFICER'S LAST DATE OF
9	EMPLOYMENT AS A PEACE OFFICER WAS 36 OR MORE BUT LESS THAN
10	60 MONTHS PRIOR TO THE DATE OF HIS PRESENT EMPLOYMENT AS A
11	PEACE OFFICER, HE MAY SATISFY HIS BASIC EDUCATIONAL
12	REQUIREMENTS AS SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (5)(C).
13	(c) A peace officer under-the-provisions-of-subsection
14	(5)(b)-or-a-peace-officer UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION
15	(5)(B) OR A PEACE OFFICER who has BEEN-ISSUED-A-BASIE
16	CERTIFICATE-BY-THE-BOARD-OF-CRIME-CONTROL-OR-HAS completed a
17	basic peace officer's course in another state and whose last
18	date of employment as a peace officer was less than $\underline{60}$
19	MONTHSBUTMORETHAN 36 months prior to the date of his
20	present appointment as a peace officer may, within 1 year of
21	his present employment or initial appointment as a peace
22	officer within this state, satisfy his basic educational
23	requirements by successfully passing a basic equivalency
24	test administered by the Montana law enforcement academy and
25	successfully completing a legal training course conducted by

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the academy. If the peace officer fails the basic
 equivalency test, he must complete the basic course within
 120 days of the date of the test.

4 (6) The board of crime control may extend the 1-year 5 time requirements of subsections (5)(a) and (5)(c) upon the 6 written application of the peace officer and the appointing authority of the officer. The application must explain the 7 circumstances which make the extension necessary. Factors 8 which the board may consider in granting or denying the 9 10 extension include but are not limited to illness of the 11 peace officer or a member of his immediate family, absence of reasonable access to the basic course or the legal 12 training course, and an unreasonable shortage of personnel 13 14 within the department. The board may not grant an extension to exceed 180 days. 15

16 (7) A peace officer who has successfully met the 17 employment standards and qualifications and the educational 18 requirements of this section and who has completed a 1-year 19 probationary term of employment shall, upon application to 20 the board of crime control, be issued a basic certificate by 21 the board, certifying that the peace officer has met all the 22 basic qualifying peace officer standards of this state."
