4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT APPROPRIATING MONEY
5 FROM THE JUNK VEHICLE STATE SPECIAL REVENUE FUND TO THE
6 GENERAL FUND; AMENDING SECTION 75-10-532, MCA; AND PROVIDING
7 AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND A PARTIAL TERMINATION DATE."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 Section 1. Appropriation. There is appropriated
11 \$500,000 from the junk vehicle state special revenue fund to
12 the general fund for the biennium ending June 30, 1987.

13 Section 2. Section 75-10-532, MCA, is amended to read:

14 "75-10-532. Disposition of moneys collected. All
15 Except as otherwise provided in [section 1], all moneys
16 received from the sale of the junk vehicles or from
17 recycling of the material and all motor vehicle wrecking
18 facility license fees and fees collected as motor vehicle
19 disposal fees shall be deposited with the state treasurer to
20 be utilized for:

21 {1} the control, collection, recycling, and disposal of
22 junk vehicles and component parts; and

23 {2} --implementation by the department of health and
24 environmental sciences during the 1985 biennium of the
25 federal Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation

1 and liability Act of 1980 in accordance with Title 75,
2 chapter 10, part 6, up to an amount not exceeding \$220,000."

3 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date --
4 termination. (1) This act is effective July 1, 1985.
5 (2) That portion of section 2 adding an exception
6 clause to 75-10-532 terminates on July 1, 1987.
