WHEREAS, the educational process dominates a large part 19 of the life of a school-age person, and as a citizen, that 20 person should be allowed representation in the major 21 decisions governing the educational process; and 22

WHEREAS, when students feel that they have influence 23 over their environment and that their opinions are 24 respected, the result is an atmosphere of greater trust, 25

2 WHEREAS, through involvement in the decisionmaking process of a school district, the student is not only 3 contributing valuable input not otherwise available, but is also receiving first-hand knowledge of the governmental 5 process and the educational process; and

WHEREAS, students are deeply concerned about 7 the 8 education they are receiving and wish to present their, views 9 on educational reform.

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11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA: 12

13 (1) That the Legislature stands strongly in favor of 14 student representation on each school district board of 15 trustees.

16 (2) That the Legislature urges each school district 17 board of trustees in the state to appoint a nonvoting student member to the board to represent the student body of 18 the school district. 19

20 (3) That the executive secretary of the Board of Public Education, the executive secretary of the Montana 21 22 Association of Student Councils, and a member of the Office 23 of Public Instruction meet and confer to define the role of 24 the student member by using as a guideline the existing 25 policy set by the Board of Public Education regarding
