5	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REQUESTING THAT
6	LIVESTOCK GRAZING FEES CHARGED ON THE CHARLES M. RUSSELL
7	WILDLIFE REFUGE BE MAINTAINED AT THE CURRENT RATE.

9	WHEREAS, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is
10	proposing to increase grazing fees on the Charles M. Russell
11	Wildlife Refuge from \$4.61 to \$5.61 per animal unit month
12	(AUM) in 1985 and \$8.75 per AUM by 1987; and
13	WHEREAS, in 1980, the grazing fee on both land
14	administered by the Bureau of Land Management and on the
15	Charles M. Russell Wildlife Refuge was \$2.36 per AUM; and
16	WHEREAS, the grazing fee on land administered by the
17	Bureau of Land Management has since decreased to \$1.35 per
18	AUM, based on a formula that includes the cost of
19	production, market price of beef, and a forage value index;
20	and
21	WHEREAS, the grazing fee on state lands is \$2.74 per
22	AUM, based on a formula that includes the market price of
23	beef; and
24	WHEREAS, in addition to the general plight of
25	agriculture resulting from low commodity prices, high

1	production costs, and an agricultural credit crisis, the
2	Charles M. Russell Wildlife Refuge area is in the midst of
3	one of the most severe droughts in the history of the area;
4	and
5	WHEREAS, maintaining the present grazing fee is one
6	small, relatively painless step the federal government can
7	take to ease the current plight of the livestock industry.
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9	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
10	OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
11	That the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is requested to
12	maintain the current rate of grazing fees charged on the
13	Charles M. Russell Wildlife Refuge.
14	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State
15	send a copy of this resolution to the manager of the Charles
16	M. Russell Wildlife Refuge, the Secretary of the Interior,
17	and each member of Montana's Congressional Delegation.
