A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA ADOPTING THE PROVINCE OF TAIWAN AS A SISTER STATE.

~~WHEREAS, the Province of Taiwan is of great strategic importance in the defense of East Asia and the Pacific; and~~

WHEREAS, the people of Taiwan are and have been among the most trusted friends of the people of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the commercial, cultural, and other nongovernmental relations between the American people and Taiwan are now and have always been excellent and mutually beneficial; and

WHEREAS, the people of Montana wish to conduct and carry out numerous economic and cultural programs, transactions, and other relations with the people of Taiwan; and

WHEREAS, Montana products are continually essential for maintaining the trade patterns which are developing between the United States and Taiwan; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has strong reason to believe that it is the will and pleasure of the people of this state

that Taiwan be adopted as a sister state.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

(1) That the Province of Taiwan is adopted as a sister state.

(2) That the Secretary of State shall send a copy of this resolution to the Governor and to the Speaker of the Provincial Assembly of the Province of Taiwan, to the President of the United States, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United States, and to the President of the Senate of the United States.
