10	WHEREAS, a land survey is used to measure land area, t
11	fix property boundary lines, and to describe a propert
12	interest in land according to a deed or other document; an
13	WHEREAS, a land survey defines property boundary line
14	by use of various descriptive elements, such as monuments
15	courses, distances, area or quantity, plats or maps, an
16	adjacent boundaries and lands; and
17	WHEREAS, errors in land surveys occur because of th
18	difficulty in retracing old surveys, locating an
19	identifying old corner markers of an original survey, and i
20	understanding the field notes and methods used by previou
21	surveyors; and
22	WHEREAS, in a land survey, the courses are expresse
23	according to the true meridian, and the variation of th
24	magnetic meridian from the true meridian must be expresse
25	on the plat; and

WHEREAS, errors in a land survey may result from
incorrect allowances made for changes in the magnetic
declination between the time of the original survey and the
time of the resurvey; and
WHEREAS, errors in land surveys lead to discrepancies
in the location of boundary lines and the proper description
of property in a deed or other instrument; and
WHEREAS, such discrepancies affect the possessory
interests of property owners, the legal rights to the use of
land, and the legal conveyance of land by deed or other
device; and
WHEREAS, land survey discrepancies seem evident in
smaller communities where lands have not been resurveyed
since the 1800s.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
That an appropriate interim committee be assigned to
study land survey discrepancies in Montana, particularly in
small communities, to determine the extent of such

discrepancies and recommend possible solutions.
