### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

S.B. 14 would restrict the opportunity to receive proceedings of the legislature at no cost currently afforded all general circulation newspapers and radio or television stations to only those media in Montana.

## **ASSUMPTIONS:**

- (1) An uncertain, but large, number of out-of-state newspapers and broadcasters are allowed to receive free copies of legislative proceedings under the current law. None have ever received free copies, but there have been recent inquiries.
- (2) The cost of proceedings is borne by the general fund. Each complete set costs something slightly in excess of \$400
- (3) The general fund is released from an unestimated liability if this bill is enacted.

# **EXPENDITURES:**

No specific savings can be calculated. The bill would protect the general fund from a potential liability.
