4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO REPEAL THE
5 MISCELLANEOUS COUNTY LICENSES ON BILLIARD TABLES AND BOWLING
6 ALLEYS; REPEALING SECTIONS 7-21-2203 AND 7-21-2204, MCA; AND
7 PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE AND A RETROACTIVE
8 APPLICABILITY DATE."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 Section 1. Repealer. Sections 7-21-2203 and 7-21-2204,
12 MCA, are repealed.

13 Section 2. Effective date -- retroactive
14 applicability. This act is effective on passage and approval
15 and applies retroactively within the meaning of 1-2-109 to
16 all license fee quarters beginning after December 31, 1984.


In compliance with a written request received January 8 _____, 1985 _____, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for S.B. 20 _____ pursuant to Title 5, Chapter 4, Part 2 of the Montana Code Annotated (MCA). Background information used in developing this Fiscal Note is available from the Office of Budget and Program Planning, to members of the Legislature upon request.

DESCRIPTION

An act to repeal the miscellaneous county licenses on billiard tables and bowling alleys and providing an immediate effective date and a retroactive applicability date.

ASSUMPTIONS

1. The dollar amount for license fees for billiard tables and bowling alleys in 1984 in Yellowstone county was obtained.
2. Yellowstone county has 14.308% of the total population in Montana. It is assumed that 14.308% of the billiard tables and bowling alleys are located in Yellowstone county. In this manner the total dollar amount collected for billiard license fees and bowling alley license fees could be determined.
3. The number of billiard tables and bowling alleys in Montana will remain constant through FY87.
4. Revenue from this source is divided: 45% to the state general fund, 55% to the county of origin.

EFFECT OF REVENUE

Using the data from Yellowstone County, it is estimated that these licenses generated \$26,561 statewide. The state general fund share would be divided as follows:

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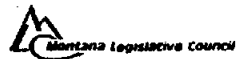
