9	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
10	Section 1. Assumption of the risk absolute defense.
11	(1) Assumption of the risk may be asserted as an absolute
12	defense in a civil action, and the provisions of 27-1-702
13	regarding comparative negligence are not applicable to the
14	defense.
15	(2) The defense requires evidence that a person
16	claiming injury:
17	(a) had knowledge of a dangerous condition;
18	<ul><li>(b) understood and appreciated the risk therefrom;</li></ul>
19	(c) voluntarily exposed himself to the risk; and
20	(d) suffered an injury that was a usual or probable
21	consequence of the dangerous condition.
22	Section 2. Applicability date. This act does not apply
23	to causes of action arising prior to October 1, 1985.
