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A bill for an act entitled: "an act to destgnate Legislative leadership positions and to provide for organization of committees should a tie vote occur for the purpose of organizing either house; amending sections 5-2-216, 5-2-221, AND 5-2-222, MCA."
be it enacted by the legislature of the state of montana:
Section 1. Section 5-2-216, MCA, is amended to read:
"5-2-216. Tie vote. (1) In the event there is a tie vote for the purposes of organizing the senate or the house of representatives then, for the purposes of organization, the political party's candidate candidates for president and president pro tempore of the senate or speaker and speaker pro tempore of the house then having a member of his their party as the governor of Montana shall be deemed to be elected.
(2) (a) If either house is organized under subsection (1) of this section, each committee of that house must be composed of an even number of members including an equal number of members of each party involved in the tie. The members of each party must be appointed by appropriate representatives of that party in accordance with the most
recent rules and customs of the house involved.
(b) Committee chairmanships must be divided evenly between the parties involved in the tie in the following manner:
(i) which party is entitled to choose a committee chairmanship first must be determined by the flip of a coin;
(ii) the parties shall then select committees to chair alternating between them until all committees have been selected.
(c) The vice-chairman of each committee must be of the opposite party from the chairman."

Section 2. Section 5-2-221, MCA, is amended to read:
"5-2-221. Officers and employees of the senate and house of representatives. (1) The officers of the senate include a president, a president pro tempore, a majority floor leader, a minority floor leader, a majority whip, and a minority whip.
(2) The officers of the house of representatives include a speaker, a speaker pro tempore, a majority floor leader, a minority floor leader, a majority whip, and a minority whip.
(3) If there is no clear majority and minority party, such as in the case of a tie between two parties, the floor leaders and whips must be referred to by party name rather than by the terms "majority" and "minority".

If there is a tie on the question of confirmation of these employees in either house, the appointment of the president or speaker is confirmed."

Section 3. Section 5-2-222, MCA, is amended to read:
"5-2-222. Powers and duties of officers. (1) The president and president pro tem of the senate and the speaker and speaker pro tem of the house of representatives may administer the oath of office to any senator or representative and to the officers and employees of their respective bodies. The officers and employees must perform such duties as are required by the rules or orders of the respective bodies which elect them.
(2) If the house or the senate is organized under 5-2-216, the floor leader of the party whose nominee is
president of the senate or speaker of the house must perform the duties normally required of the majority floor leader unless the rules or orders of the house involved prescribe otherwise."

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Authority of legislature with regard to internal organization. Either house of the legislature may designate, by a majority vote of all members, its own officers, their titles, duties, and means of selection. Each house may determine its own committees and the method of appointing members and selecting chairmen. In the event there is no majority vote to the contrary, the provisions of 5-2-216, 5-2-221, and 5-2-222 govern.
