### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Senate Bill 83 directs the Department of Justice, Motor Vehicle Division, to establish a special chauffeur's license to drive a truck weighing more than 44,000 pounds; exempts holders of a current chauffeur's license; requires training of Driver's Examiners.

# **ASSUMPTIONS:**

- It is assumed that the effective date of the proposed legislation will be changed to October 1, 1985 2. to coincide with the grandfather clause (Section 3).
